1. TR – Welcomed everyone to the meeting, including the new members - Minutes of last meeting briefly looked through, all agreed.

2. Feedback/Presentations from current PPG projects:

Walking for Health – KW (Walk leader) Started end of April, approx. 8 people per walk, registration has increased to 30, one walk there was 18 people – due to the different capabilities the group has been split into two; strollers and striders! Due to the increase of numbers more Leaders are required; one day course plus shadow a leader. Good local support and advertising (Waitrose).

Local Buses, No.57 – RM, No.57 loss, west end of Sherborne isolated, First Stop X11 two routes; one very early in the morning, second late afternoon) – Positive meeting with Helen Reed; NORCAT (voluntary service) £5 annual membership, door to door service (based in Sturminster Newton) 17 vehicles, needs more funds. The NORCAT bus passes can be used on other buses. NORCAT have day trips etc. (must book first) **RM/TR/TM** – to investigate the three GP surgeries clinic times, poss. arrange clinics around travel?

Gryphon School – TR; nothing new to report due to the summer holidays, TR will chase his contact in the new school term.

Sheltered Housing – RM; 'My life my care' seems to have been lost in Dorset County Council website. Bournemouth and Christchurch still have this service. RM still pending

Carer's week – TM; great success, one day outside Waitrose (already in the pipeline for 2019).

3. Newland/Bute updates:

Newlands – RM contacting Di Loughlin (CCG) with regards to the housing/premises project (Financial Levey), new equipment? – RM chasing DNA – More detailed analysis breakdown from the practice (3 months of data) Receptionist vacancy – over 70 applications Newsletters – PPG produce the publications with input from the surgery

Bute – TM; DNA, Bute don't have a problem, all three surgeries will review their data (aligning the process to make sure that the same cohort of the report are the same, three surgeries do use the same clinical system) TM has been in touch with a journalist who is interested in running this story.

Continuing with the Interaction between the three surgeries, it has been agreed that a representation from the Yeatman should always be invited.
