

SHERBORNE PRIMARY CARE NETWORK - If a GP wants to see you and you do have COVID-19 symptoms you may be asked to see the GP in an isolation room (currently situated at The Grove Medical Centre) the GP will give you all the details/instructions during the Telephone consultation.

PRACTICE PROCEDURES FOR NON-COVID-19 PATIENTS – The practice has limited the face to face consultations, mostly via Telephone triage via contact reception, GP/clinician will phone you back, please do make sure that you are in or that you have your mobile to hand, it's very frustrating for the clinician to keep calling you back (for results this may not be until the GP who has requested your test is in the practice)

BABY IMMUNISTAIONS/VACCINATIONS, LEG/WOUND DRESSINGS - have continued, and from 1st June, the slow introduction of routine services; e.g. Smears, Pneumococcal, Health Checks, Minor Ops (only when safe to do so and at the GPs decision) will start.



If collecting a <u>prescription</u>, you will be sent an SMS message, of when to collect the prescription, please pay by card over the phone - again when coming to the surgery, phone the surgery and tell of your visit, or if no phone, please ring the door bell and wait for a receptionist to see you (the receptionist will be wearing a mask and/or visor) prescriptions will be placed on a trolley in the car park

Video Consultation – please see our Facebook page for full information or discuss with the clinician when you phone the surgery - It's completely free to use. iPhones running older software that has not been updated (iOS 12 and earlier) will need to download the 'Whereby' app to join the consultation (you will not require to create a Whereby app account).

You will be sent a link via SMS which will take you both through to a video consultation on your phones.

As a patient you agree to take part in the process by clicking on the link to the video consultation. You can dissent at any point by either not clicking on the link to the video consultation or leaving the video consultation.
