New Clinical Floor:

On 14th March 2024 the new treatment rooms will be opened by Chris Loder MP. Nurses, Pharmacists and Nurse Practitioners will work from the new floor, named as Entrance B (explained in previous Soundbites)

What can a Nurse Practitioner do:

A Prescribing Nurse can, have a level of authority to prescribing medications. Their roles can also include

- a) education on disease prevention
- b) ordering, analysis and discussion of the results from diagnostic tests
- c) assessing patients' conditions
- d) diagnoses and treatment of patients

Behind the scenes at the surgery:

Some patients have mentioned to me about the apparent lack of action at the surgery! It is not obvious how much work goes on behind the scenes.

GPs deal with test results and informing the patient (if not using the NHS App)

GPs receive daily tasks from a variety of teams; Dispensary, PCN Pharmacy, Frailty, Mental Health Team, plus outside providers i.e. Social Services, Health visitors, Secondary care,

GPs have to action admin requested by patients i.e. Medical forms/Insurance forms, private letters etc! and much more!

Different methods of communication:

There are a number of different method of communication that the practice communicates with you; email, SMS, phone calls or letters.

The group communicates through the Newsletters, Website and monthly Soundbites (SMS)

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NHS Pharmacy First Advanced Service:

The new Pharmacy First Service will enable community pharmacists to complete episodes of care for patients without the need for the patient to visit their general practice. This, alongside expansions to the pharmacy blood pressure checking and contraception services, could save up to 10 million general practice team appointments a year and help patients access quicker and more convenient care.

Patients will be able to access the new service via referrals, such as from NHS 111, General Practice and Emergency Departments or by walking into the pharmacy directly, or where appropriate, by contacting them by video consultation.

How pharmacies can help

Pharmacists can give you advice on a range of conditions and suggest medicines you can buy that can help. They may also be able to offer treatment for some conditions, without you needing to see a GP:

- earache
- impetigo
- infected insect bites
- shingles
- sinusitis
- sore throat
- urinary tract infections (UTIs)

If you go to a pharmacy with one of these conditions, the pharmacist will offer you advice, treatment or refer you to a GP or other healthcare professional.

They will then update your GP health record.

So this is a great way to help the Surgery if those options could fit your requirements
